What is Google Classroom?

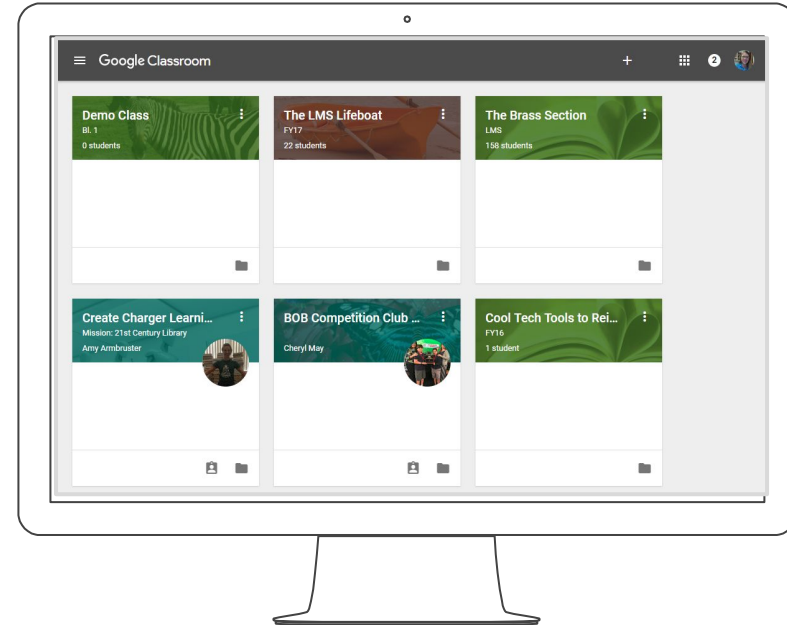
Classroom is a free web service for schools, non-profits, and anyone with a personal Google Account. Classroom makes it easy for learners and instructors to connect—inside and outside of schools.

Classroom is a product in G Suite for Education, which also includes Google Drive, Docs, Sheets, Slides, and more. Classroom works with G Suite for Education so that instructors and students can communicate easily, create classes, distribute work, and stay organized. Learn more about Classroom.

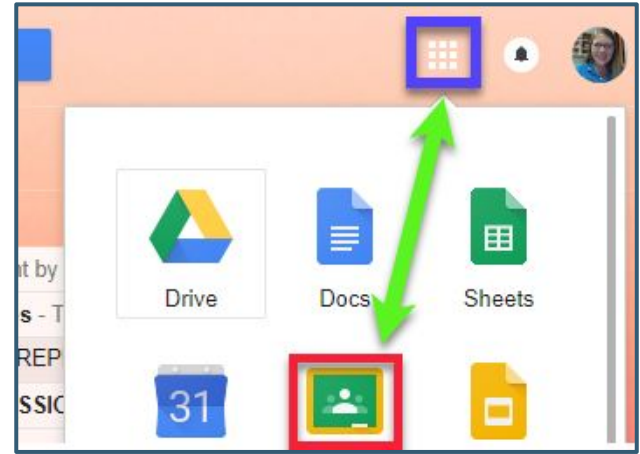
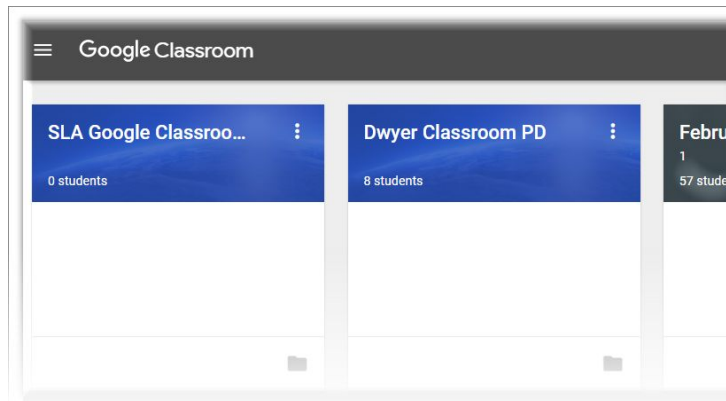

What Can Students Do in Google Classroom?

Students can

- Keep track of classwork and materials
- Share resources and interact in class stream
- Submit assignments
- Get feedback and grades
- Access anytime, anywhere on the web or via the Android or iOS Classroom mobile app



What Can Guardians Do in Google Classroom?

As a guardian, you can receive email summaries showing your student's progress in Classroom.

You can choose the frequency of the emails, such as daily or weekly.
You can unsubscribe or remove yourself from Classroom at any time.



Guardian email summaries include:

Missing work—Work that's late at the time the email was sent

Upcoming work—Work that's due today and tomorrow (for daily emails) or work that's due in the upcoming week (for weekly emails)

Class activity—Announcements, assignments, and questions recently posted by teachers

Note: Guardians can't access Classroom or their child's assignments due to privacy laws. Guardians can only get email summaries. [How to Set Up Guardian Email Summaries](#)
